HELP NEW AND EXPECTANT MOTHERS:

PROVIDE PARENTAL NOTIFICATION:

We support pro-family policies such as parent notification before a minor has an abortion. A parent's role in providing emotional and psychological support before, during, and after an abortion should be protected.

REJECT MANDATES THAT DENY PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND CONSCIENCE PROTECTIONS:

We oppose all policies that force people of faith to act contrary to their conscience. This includes mandating Comprehensive Sex Education (CSE) in grades K-12.

Make appointments in advance of your visit to the Capitol, but remember that a legislator's schedule may be difficult to predict. A meeting with staff is sometimes most productive.

Make your point clear and concise.
It is easy to overwhelm legislators with too
