St. Vincent de Paul of Seattle-King County's advocacy model is built on the experiences and relationships of Vincentian volunteers during their visits with neighbors in need. Vincentians are organized into volunteer groups called conferences that operate out of their local parishes. In King County there are 51 Vincentian conferences working to provide material assistance and a spiritual presence to individuals across their neighborhoods. In addition, our Centro Rendu program works with Latino families across South King County, providing case management, youth mentorship, education, and more.
